Maurice's funeral will take place at St Luke's Church. Further details will be shared in due course.


Please keep Maurice's daughters, Lynne, Sarah, and Angie, and the whole family in your prayers at this difficult time, along with all who mourn his loss.

**Begins 10th February, 2pm-3.30pm**

*Week 1 - 10th February - ALL welcome!*

*Sue Atkinson, Partner from Battboardbent Solicitors will be speaking about Wills and Lasting Powers of Attorney (LPAs).*



This is a gentle, practical six-week course on preparing for the end of life. It's a sensitive topic, but an important one. As Christians, we hold to the hope of the gospel and can face these conversations with honesty and without fear, supporting one another with compassion. Each week we will welcome a different speaker to guide us through key aspects of end-of-life planning, including:

- A solicitor – making a will and setting up powers of attorney
- A local funeral director – understanding the role of an undertaker
- A GP – how to approach difficult but important conversations with family and friends
- A hospice representative – insight into hospice care and support
- Vicar Jane – planning an order of service that reflects your wishes

The course will take place in church, with tea and cakes served each week. Invite friends or come along for information and a way of supporting others facing end of life.


## Love In A Box

## Furzey Gardens Appeal

In 1986 the Minstead Training Project was established at Furzey Gardens by Martin Lenaerts, a former cistercian monk with a gardening vocation, working with five young adults with learning disabilities. Horticulture is known to offer real benefits through outdoor physical and therapeutic activity, providing important work and social skills and an opportunity for meaningful activity. Along with a team of people with learning disabilities and some dedicated gardeners and volunteers the gardens have evolved to the space you see before you today.


Today, people with learning disabilities are still at the heart of the garden and given the opportunity to thrive. A team of gardeners, volunteers and around 30 people with learning disabilities work hard to maintain the Gardens and bring on plants in the nursery.

Furzey Gardens needs your help. Worn out tools and equipment mean everyday tasks have become harder, and not as accessible to all. Our plant range has also slowly dwindled. You can
